

Talking Toddlers

What is Talking Toddlers?

Talking Toddlers is a group program designed to improve communication in toddlers. Participants learn by doing, talking and acting on objects in an interactive learning environment that is communication and activity-based as well as rich in language and literacy.

Individual goals are addressed for children who have expressive language delays and may have receptive delays and/or difficulty with speech sounds.

Talking Toddlers is led by a licensed speech-language pathologist with the support of graduate student clinicians. Talking Toddlers enrolls children between the ages of 18 and 35 months.

Talking Toddlers Targets:

- Imitating sounds, words and phrases
- Communication turn taking
- Requesting by pointing, vocalizing or using words
- Using single words and short phrases
- Vocabulary development
- Sharing attention



Cost: \$90/session (may be insurance eligible) plus \$150 nonrefundable enrollment fee
