What is SPARC?

Speech and ARtiCulation (SPARC) group is designed to improve speech sound production, speech movement patterns and intelligibility in children ages 3 and 4 years of age. The group program is appropriate for children who are motivated to communicate, but their verbal speech is often not understood by their communication partners.

The program uses a thematic play-based learning environment to support relevant, meaningful and functional speech and language therapy. SPARC also introduces and addresses phonological awareness (prereading) skills. Individual goals are addressed for children who have moderate to severe speech sound disorders and delays, such as phonological, Childhood Apraxia of Speech or motor speech.

SPARC is led by a licensed speech-language pathologist with the support of graduate student clinicians.

SPARC Targets:

- Syllable shape production
- Speech sound production
- Producing meaningful and functional target words
- Repetitive speech practice in play-based activities
- Speech movements between sounds
- Increasing overall speech intelligibility
