What is STEPS?

Supportive Treatment of Eating in Preschoolers (STEPS) is a small-group intervention program for preschoolers ages 2 to 5 years with moderate to severe motor-based feeding disorders and accompanying sensory-motor issues. Preschoolers may or may not have swallowing problems, and they may or may not have typical language.

Feeding difficulties may include:

- Chewing
- Eating off of a spoon
- Drinking out of an open cup
- Drinking through a straw
- Transitioning to solid foods

STEPS is designed to facilitate improved oral motor skills for feeding while providing hands-on training for parents. Normal development of feeding skills, strategies to support family mealtimes and techniques to improve stability and function during feeding are taught.

The group is led by a licensed speech-language pathologist with support from speech-language pathology graduate student clinicians who provide one-on-one therapy for children and parents in the context of the larger group.
